








- Lapland, the northernmost Finland
 - area of 100 000 square km = 1/3 of Finland
 - 185 000 inhabitants = 5 % of Finnish inhabitants
 - 200 000 reindeer = 99 % of Finnish reindeer
- tourism is a strategic economic sector in Lapland
- 80-90 % of the tourism companies are micro or small size
- Lapland is a "brand", thus highly sensitive of crises and PR damages












































Lapland's market share of overnights in Finland 2001-2010

























































STRUCTURE OF PRIVATE BUSINESS

Turnover in Lapland












Estimation of the direct tourism income in Lapland 2009

- Tourism related rental and other personal services 7 milj. € (1 %)


